CLARIFICATION NOTE

ENTRY TO SPAIN FOR SPANISH AND EU CITIZENS

Must provide ONE of the following Certificates:

- a) Vaccination Certificate: Valid from 14 days after receiving the complete vaccination schedule (authorized vaccines by the EMA or WHO: Pfizer, Moderna, Astra Zeneca, Janssen, Sinopharma and Sinovac)
- b) A Negative Test Certificate: (PCR or Antigen) within 48 hours before arrival
- c) A Recovery Certificate, those who have been previously infected

ENTRY TO SPAIN FOR PEOPLE COMING FROM QATAR WHO ARE NOT SPANISH OR EU CITIZENS

A) ENTRY TO SPAIN FOR PEOPLE COMING FROM QATAR FOR TOURISM OR OTHER NON –ESSENTIAL REASON

Non Spanish travelers from Qatar, who wants to travel to Spain for tourism or another reason that does not fall within the exceptional reasons (see section C below) can enter proving that they have been vaccinated, at least 14 days after receiving the complete vaccination schedule from an approved vaccine from EMA or WHO (K letter Order INT/ 552/2021).

B) APPLICABLE RULE FOR MINORS ACCOMPANIED BY VACCINATED ADULTS.

- Minors under 12 years old: not required to present any certificates or supporting documents.
- From 12 to 18 years old: alternatively any of the three possible certificates: vaccination, negative test or proof of Recovery. Just submit ONE of them.

C) ENTRY TO SPAIN FOR TRAVELERS FROM QATAR WHO PRESENTS AN EXCEPTIONAL REASON: DIPLOMATS, PERSONNEL DEDICATED TO THE TRANSPORT, STUDENTS, HUMANITARIAN REASONS, ETC.

Travelers from Qatar who proves any of the exceptional cases established by the Order of the Ministry of the Interior 552/2021, such as diplomats, personnel dedicated to the transport, students, humanitarian reasons, etc., must present ONE OF THE FOLLOWING THREE CERTIFICATES:

- a) Vaccination Certificate: Valid from 14 days after receiving the complete vaccination schedule (authorized vaccines by the EMA or WHO: Pfizer, Moderna, Astra Zeneca, Janssen, Sinopharma and Sinovac)
- b) A Negative Test Certificate: (PCR or Antigen) within 48 hours before arrival
- c) A Recovery Certificate, those who have been previously infected
